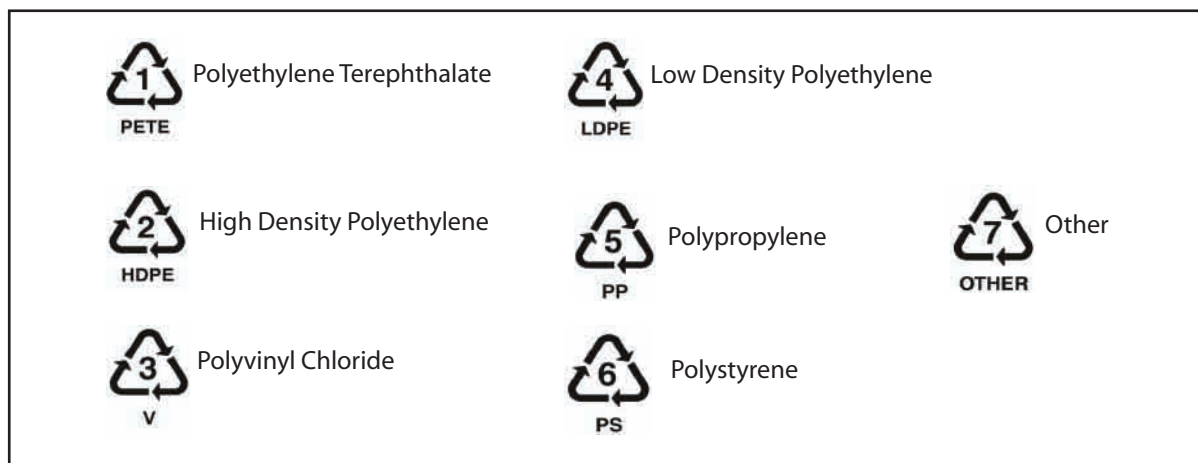


ThermoServ Statement Regarding SAN Material

(Dallas) May 7, 2008 – On April 11, 2008, in response to misleading news reports portraying all plastic products labeled with the recycle symbol 7 as dangerous for food contact, ThermoServ denounced such allegations as applied to its own line of products. The deceptive news reports referred to products made from polycarbonate plastic (which are also categorized by the recycle symbol 7), in which a raw material used in the making of this plastic (bisphenol A, or BPA) may not be fully reacted and could escape from the plastic in small amounts. ThermoServ products are not made from this material. Some of ThermoServ clear products, single-wall and double-wall mugs and tumblers are manufactured from SAN polymer, Styrene Acrylonitrile. SAN polymer material is free of BPA and, like all materials used by ThermoServ, meets the requirements of the FDA for food contact applications.

Recycle symbols located on the bottom of plastic bottles, containers and packaging include a number within the recycling “mobius” arrows and, usually, the chemical resin in acronym form. Although the presence of this symbol implies that the plastic item is recyclable, the icon is actually used by the plastics industry to identify the type of material from which the products are made. The following depicts which materials are represented by these images:
